Elders and Fire Safety



he Independent Council on Aging (ICA) recently had a speaker from the fire department talk to its members about fire safety and our elders and brought attention to this important subject.

The death rate in fires for people over 85 is three times the national average (National Fire Protection Assoc). Why? Lack of mobility, medications that slow decision making, living alone and kitchen fires caused by unattended or forgotten pots on the stove.

Other contributing factors are alternative heating sources like kerosene or electric space heaters, wood stoves and fireplaces. Smoking is a leading cause. And electrical problems like overloaded outlets, old and worn appliances, or old wiring.
