We Now Take SNAP Benefits



e were approved by the Commonwealth as a SNAP Merchant (SNAP stands for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program previously known as food stamps). This means we will be able to take the Access Card for payment of home delivered meals. This will open up an entirely new segment of the population we are not serving now.

Simply speaking, it will increase our life impacts and get meals to those who need them most.

We are being trained on our Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) machine today. We will use paper vouchers because no one will swipe their EBT Card like they do in retail stores.



Payments must be signed for at each purchase either once a week or once a month. SNAP clients may be constrained to only once a month payments but that needs to be determined in the real world. This is a new venture for us and we are consulting with other MOW's in PA that take SNAP. As they say, "Details to follow..."
